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## EQUINE HEALTH OUTLINE

F/R = Flu/Rhino, (Influenza & Rhinopneumonitis)

EWT/WNV = West Nile Virus, Eastern, Western encephalitis and Tetanus Toxoid

Pregnant mares:

- Vaccinate with Flu/Rhino, EWT/WNV with-in 30 days prior to foaling.
- Pneumabort K - prevents abortion from Rhinopneumonitis in pregnant mares, vaccinate @ 5<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, & 9<sup>th</sup> month of pregnancy.

Foals:

- At birth 1 ml E-se (selenium) injection and if mare not vaccinated give Tetanus Toxoid vaccination.
- EWT/WNV
  - Vaccinated mares: First dose @ 4 months, repeat in 4 weeks and again @ 10 to 12 months old
  - Non-vaccinated mares: First dose @ 2 months, repeat in 4 weeks and again @ 10 to 12 months old
- Flu/Rhino
  - Give first vaccination @ 4 to 6 months of age followed by 2 boosters at 3 week intervals

**FOR ALL HORSES 2 YEARS & OLDER – WE RECOMMEND A DENTAL EXAM ANNUALLY OR PRIOR TO TRAINING**

Ask the veterinarian if you have any questions regarding any vaccinations. We can also have Rabies, Strangles/StrepVac, and Potomac Horse Fever vaccinations available upon request.
